

#### What is the internet?...

A vast global computer network which represents a revolutionary medium for accessing and sharing information!

Demographically we're wired! Women are going on-line, and the numbers are increasing at a rapid pace.

Access to information and communication is what the Internet is about - and as such, the challenges and opportunities it can present for women are potentially enormous.

The Internet provides women with a quick and effective way to research and seek out information on various topics.

The Internet is an excellent medium for connecting older rural women who are isolated. It provides access to large amounts of information at a time and place to suit you.

The Internet enables you to:

- \* research information and library catalogues;
- \* communicate with friends,

family and work colleagues;

- join special interest discussion groups;
- \* run a business or undertake study;
- \* read newspapers and magazines from all over the world;
- **\*** publish newsletters and articles;
- gain technical support for your computer; and
- shop online for products and services.

## Searching the net...

Searching for information on the Internet is not always easy. However, once you spend time on the web, you will begin to feel that there is no limit to the amount of information you can find. Search Engines are a great tool that help you track down information on the Web.

Some popular search engines are Yahoo! <www.yahoo.com.au>, Web Wombat

<www.webwombat.com.au> and
Altavista <www.altavista.com>.

Put simply, if you don't know an address for a specific topic, a search engine will help you find websites that cover the subject you're looking for. You'll be offered a box to type in some key words - which might be 'body image' or 'transport'. The search engine will scan the web and offer you a list of sites to choose from.

### Networking

Email (which stands for electronic mail) is fast becoming the new way for people to communicate with one another. Using email enables you to send and receive messages anywhere in the world - it's a great way to keep in touch with family and friends!

Some websites such as: Yahoo! <www.yahoo.com.au> and Hot Mail <www.hotmail.com> provide free e-mail. All you need is a place to access your email such as your local library, school, internet cafe or your own home.
