I&I NSW Game Fish Tagging Program

Another exciting recapture reported to the I&I NSW Game Fish Tagging Program was that of a yellowfin tuna, first released off Durras, near Batemans Bay on the south coast of NSW and recaptured off Wari Island, Papua New Guinea (PNG). The tuna was estimated to be 70cm long and was tagged by *Wicked One* on 27 May 2007. The fish was recaptured over three years later by a commercial boat operating out of Port Moresby, PNG, on 28 October 2010. On recapture, the fish was reported to be 125cm long and weigh 32kg. It had travelled a straight line distance of 1462 nautical miles north from its release point. Out of the 623 reported recaptures of yellowfin tuna, this recent fish comes in at the 12th longest distance recapture.



Fishers for Fish Habitat Forum to be held in Tamworth

The country music capital will be buzzing with activity of a different kind in the middle of May as recreational fishers from across NSW converge on the regional city for the 2011 Fishers for Fish Habitat Forum. The forum aims to raise awareness of issues affecting fish habitat and our fisheries resources with a strong focus on freshwater systems. The forum is free for all recreational fishers and is a component of the angler driven I&I NSW Fishers for Fish Habitat project.

The forum will be held on 20 and 21 May and this is the first time the Forum will be held west of the range. In another Forum first, participants will also be able to wet a line and join other anglers in the inaugural Tamworth Carp Muster on Sunday 22 May. Hosted by the Namoi Catchment Management Authority, the fishing event is open to the general public and will provide the Forum participants a great opportunity to unwind, meet other fishers and share some new habitat knowledge. New look for Fish Aggregating Devices (FADs)

Some anglers may have noticed a change in the design of the 25 FADs installed along the NSW coast. The FADs now have a much larger cylindrical headgear which allows the FAD to remain on the surface in stronger currents and makes them easier to locate from a distance. Fishing reports indicate that the FADs are fishing well this season. Check out the I&I NSW website for the FAD locations. More fish for inland rivers, lake and dams

Following on from recent high water levels on most of our inland rivers, lake and dams I&I NSW fish hatcheries have produced and stocked more than 250,000 fish into a range of inland waterways during February to enhance recreational fishing opportunities. These stockings have comprised of 44,000 brown trout fingerlings, 51,250 rainbow trout fingerlings, 143,000 golden perch fry and 18,000 silver perch fry. Some of the major stockings include 49,000 golden perch fry and 18,000 silver perch fry into Lake Windamere, 58,000 golden perch fry into Wyangala Dam and 20,000 golden perch fry into Lake Cargelligo.

The draft Plan of Management for Sydney Harbour National Park is currently on public exhibition until 30 April 2011. The Plan outlines the proposed management of the National Park over the next ten years.
